Written as a text, this book looks at the external history of French from its Latin origins to the present day through some of the analytical frameworks developed by contemporary sociolinguistics. French is one of the most highly standardized of the world's languages and the author invites us to see the language as heterogenous, rather than a monolithic entity, using the model proposed by E. Haugen as a useful comparative grid to plot the development of standardization. After an introductory section which examines the dialectalization of Latin in Gaul, the four central chapters of the book are constructed around the basic processes involved in standardization as identified by Haugen: the selection of norms, the elaboration of function, codification and acceptance. The concluding chapter deals with language variability and the wide gulf that has now developed between French used for formal purposes and that used in everyday speech, with particular reference to Occitan speaking regions. Emphasizing the ordinary speakers of the language, rather than the statesmen or great authors as agents of change, the book combines a traditional history of the language' approach with a sociolinguistic framework to provide a broad and comparative overview of the problem of language standardization. Franche-Comt é The dictionary explores Brazil's langue populaire and argot (g í ria), concentrating on the world of crime and crime-fighting and listing notably the vocabulary employed in the metropolises of S ã o Paulo and Rio de Janeiro. These terms are paired off with definitions in French and equivalents taken from fran ç ais populaire and French argot. This approach is also applied to the closely interwoven professional and group jargons encountered in a variety of social sectors such as school, factory labor, art, information, games and sports (football), as well as the language of young

people, who in Brazil constitute a well-defined social category of their own.

This study presents the usage markings (diastatic, diachronic, dianormative etc.) assigned to a selected sample of words and usages by fourteen 19th century French dictionaries, from "Lavaux" (1820) to the "Nouveau Larousse Illustré" of 1904. The development discernible is related to the history of linguistics and society. This points up the sometimes considerable significance of relatively little known dictionaries, without in any way gainsaying the originality of the "Littré" or the specific merits of the "Dictionnaire Général", the first dictionary to reflect the influence of theoretical linguistics (Darmesteter, Gilliéron etc.).
